EMERGENCY TRAIL PHONES
A system of Emergency Trail Phones exists throughout the network of trails at Copper Mountain. Phones can be identified as a red box with a white cross on the door. Pick up the phone and dial the number provided inside the box to report problems or injuries to Ski Patrol. Ski Patrol can be reached, for emergencies only, at ext. 66111 from a house phone, or from an outside line at 970-968-3311. For general information, please dial 970-968-2318 ext. 66114 or ext. 66114 from a house phone.

SLOW AND FAMILY ZONES
Specific areas indicated on the trail map are designated as Slow and Family Zones. Please ski or ride at a rate that is consistent with the beginner and intermediate skiers are riders on these trails. The Ski Patrol monitors these areas and will revoke the privileges of those who are considered to be fast or reckless.

TERRAIN PARKS AND SUPERPIPE
 Scope around the jumps first, not over them. Inspect features before use and throughout the day. One person on a feature at a time. Know your landings are clear and clear yourself out of the landing area quickly. The use of a spotter is recommended.
 Start small and work your way up. Always ride or ski in control and within your ability level. You control the degree of difficulty you will encounter in using these features both on the ground and in the air. Inverted aerials not recommended.
 From the lift line through the park. Do not enter the Freestyle Terrain or use features when closed.

Freestyle Terrain includes, but is not limited to, Terrain Parks and Terrain Park Features such as jumps, rails, fun boxes, and all other constructed and natural features, half-pipes, quarter-pipes and freestyle-bump terrain. Conditions and configurations of Freestyle Terrain will vary due to changing weather and snow conditions, grooming, and user traffic. Users should make a reasonable inspection prior to participating and clear the area for others. Do not stop or stand where you are not visible from above. Freestyle Terrain is marked as containing small, medium and/or large features. Choose terrain that is appropriate to your ability.

TUCKER MOUNTAIN CAT TOURS FREE Tucker Mountain is as close to a backcountry experience as you will find inside any resort. Access Tucker Mountain by hiking the rim of Copper Bowl or by taking a ride in our 10 passenger Tucker Mt. Snow Cat. The Tucker Cat provides access, free of charge, to the halfway point where a 15-20 minute walk remains. This terrain opens only when conditions permit from 10am to 2pm. The Tucker Cat runs from 10am until 1:30pm. **Due to various conditions, the Tucker Cat may not run on any given day.** Terrain openings and conditions may vary and are subject to change based on seasonal snowfall and daily weather.

EASIEST TERRAIN
Green trails are ideal for beginners, families and children. Conditions which may exist; powder and some groomed trails.

INTERMEDIATE TERRAIN
Blue trails are ideal for intermediate snowriders. A variety of conditions may exist; powder, small bumps and some groomed trails.

EXPERT TERRAIN
Black diamond trails are designated for advanced snowriders. A variety of conditions may exist; bumps, powder and select groomed trails.

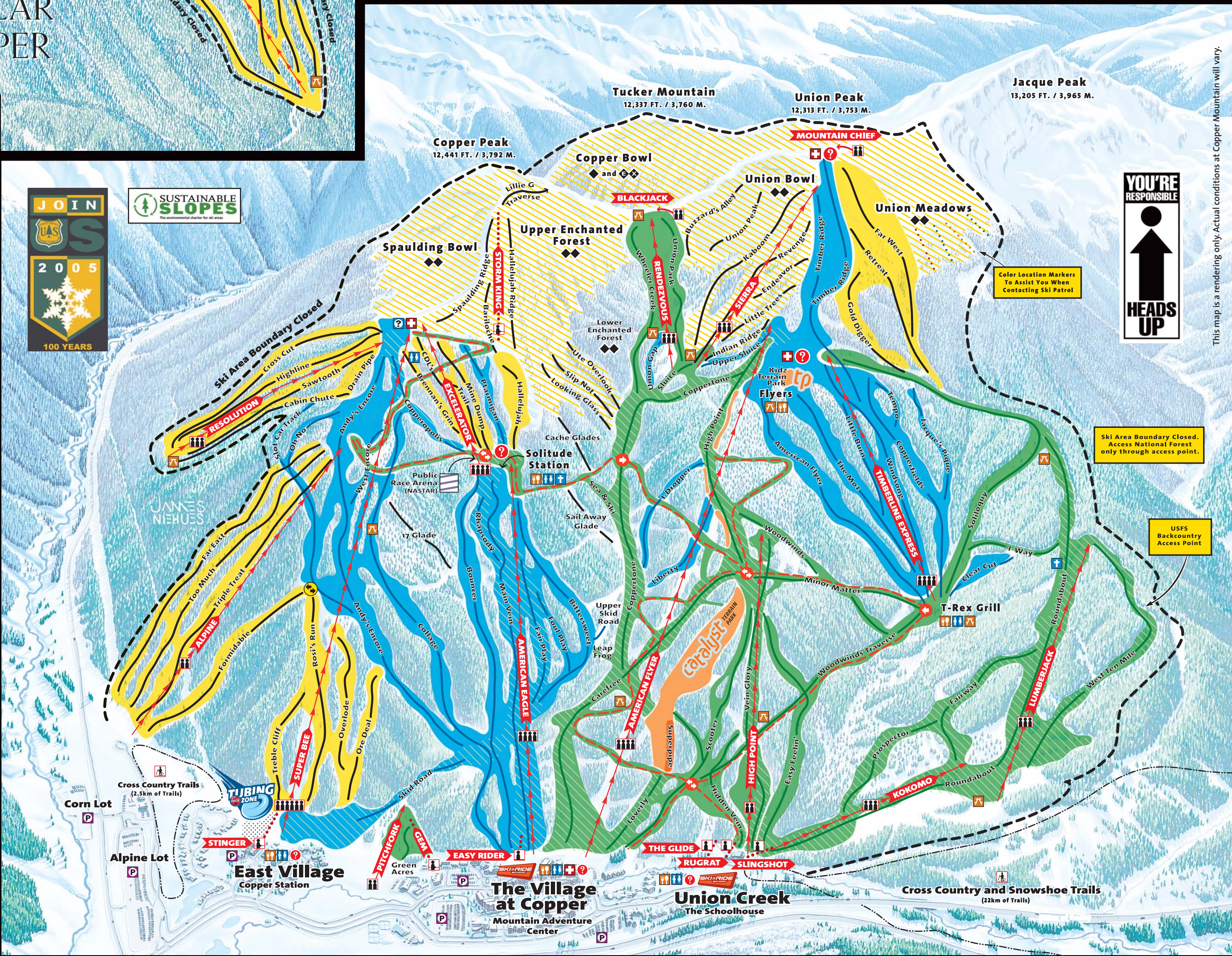
FREESTYLE TERRAIN
Freestyle Terrain provides the ideal place for skiers and riders to showcase their talents or learn new tricks. Features include jumps, rails, boxes and pipes. Start small at the Playground Kidz Park at the top of the American Flyer Lift. Follow High Point Trail to the Catalyst Terrain Park. There you'll find features to stoke anyone's appetite, as well as the Superpipe that is maintained by our new Zaugg Pipe Monster.

HIGH ALPINE ADVENTURE TERRAIN
High Alpine Adventure Terrain is not groomed and is designated for expert snowriders only (black and double black diamond). A variety of natural conditions may exist; bumps, powder, bowls, steeps and cornices.

EXTREME TERRAIN
Extreme Terrain contains cliffs, very steep (50 degree or greater pitch) slopes, as well as rocks and other hazards. Skiing or snowboarding Extreme Terrain is for EXPERTS ONLY.
